
Homeroom/1st Period starts promptly at 7:30 AM

Arrival: Security Protocol / Lockers:

- 1. All Students are REQUIRED to enter through the Front Bridge Entrance at the High School and participate in security protocols.
- 2. New Evolv scanner will require you to walk through the scanner with your laptop in hand. Other items that will alert are 3 ring binders and umbrellas
- 3. If the scanner alerts on your person or belongings, you will be asked to go through a secondary search.
- 4. Student arrival and door opening will begin at 7:05 AM.
- 5. Busses will drop-off students at the Stadium Entrance at the High School and front entrance.
- 6. Parents will drop-off students at the Front Bridge Entrance at the High School.
- 7. Parents are required to show ID at Front Check-In when entering.



School Supplies and Materials:

- **Required:** Please ensure your student has their laptop charged for immediate use on arrival.
- Laptop Distribution Procedure: Dr. Zupsic Reporting
 - Please ensure student has their laptop and charger, with laptop charged for immediate use on arrival.
 - Students are permitted to bring a water bottle for water each day. Water bottle adapters have been installed on water fountains for students to refill during the day.
 - Please keep personal items to a minimum to reduce check-in time during morning security protocols.
- Materials can be kept in lockers: Keep lockers locked at all times and do not share with others All materials in the locker are the responsibility of the student. Do not share combination with others.
- Guidance can give your student locker number, or on their profile in Infinite Campus.





Transportation: ABC Transit

- AM Arrival: Buses drop off in front of the building on arrival 7:05 7:20 AM
- PM Dismissal: Students will be dismissed at 2:26 PM
- PM All busses are lined up at the Front Entrance of the High School by bus number for dismissal.
- <u>Bus Assignments:</u> Students must ride the bus they are assigned to.
- Any student wishing to ride another bus home or to school on a specific day **are required** to present a written parent note in the morning to the front office in order to receive a temporary bus pass to present to the driver.
- <u>NO</u> students will be permitted to ride another bus without a written bus pass.

Procedures and Discipline:

- **Detention** What can result in detention? Truancy, Policy Violations Skipping Class, Late to Class, Tardiness to School.
- Written Warning 1-5 tardies
- 6-9 tardies Administrative Detention
- 10-15 tardies 2 Administration Detentions
- 15+: In School Suspension, Out of School Suspension, Loss of Social Privileges including but not limited to students ability to participate in school dances, clubs, trips, field trips, use of parking pass, approved work permit, keystone rewards, athletic activities, sports and other privileges determined by administration.
- Bullying of any kind including Cyber Bullying will not be tolerated and will result in loss of privileges.
- **Suspension**: After-school activities, dances, and limiting student participation is a direct result of Discipline.
- Dress Code It is Enforced Student Handbook
- Please consider when applying for Post-Secondary Education and Careers/Employment discipline is reviewed if a Level III or higher

Academic Eligibility: Athletics

Grades: Eligibility will now be checked on the last school day of every week. Most of the time that will be Friday, but if we have a short week, it will be checked on the last day.

Eligibility: E-mails sent to principals and coaches on the last day of the school week. Coaches will communicate with the student-athletes and parents about academic and attendance eligibility issues. Please direct questions to the Athletic Director.

- Academic requirements: Student-athletes must be passing four full-credit (4* 1.00 credit) classes weekly. If they fail to meet the PIAA requirements- they are out from Sunday through Saturday.
- Failure to meet this requirement=ineligibility



Academic Eligibility: Athletics

Grades: Eligibility will now be checked on the last school day of every week. Most of the time that will be Friday, but if we have a short week, it will be checked on the last day.

- Attendance requirements: Accumulation of more than twenty (20) days of unexcused absences: Student will be ineligible to participate in athletics (inter-school practice, scrimmage or contest) until the student has been in attendance for a total of forty-five (45) school days following the student's twentieth (20th) day of absence, which may fall into the following school year.
- Final Spring grades determine Fall Eligibility If you fail a class and do not meet 4 (1.00) credit classes, you will not be eligible to practice in the summer or play in the Fall without credit recovery.
- If a student has In School Suspension, he/she will not be permitted to practice or play that day. In School Suspension will be treated the same as Out of School Suspension when it comes to extracurriculars.



Academic Eligibility: Athletics and NCAA

- All students are required to maintain Academic Eligibility to remain active in their athletic team – Passing 4 (1.00) credit classes
- Please review the Student Handbook for Academic Eligibility
- Play a sport at Division I, II, III, and club/participation levels – NCAA website – Make an appointment with Athletic Director to ensure meeting requirements – Sign-up for the NCAA portal as soon as possible.

School Nurse:

Medication at school: If your student requires daily medication: Nurse must administer all medications – Please bring a properly labeled container from the pharmacy with original prescription label on the bottle/box – Required to drop off directly to the Nurse. The nurse will keep the medication and can administer as prescribed on the label.

• Exception=students may carry an inhaler but must inform the nurse.

Attendance: How does attendance work at the high school?

- ATTENDANCE MATTERS!!!
- STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO BE PRESENT AND ENGAGED during every class every day.
- To move through the security line quickly, students should plan to arrive at school as close to 7:05 AM as possible.
- Homeroom (1st Period) attendance is taken at 7:30 AM. Please arrive to class promptly.
- If a student must arrive late or leave early, they must bring a signed parent/guardian note or parental e-mail to the front office (Lori Chickos, lori.chickos@ambridge.k12.pa.us)



Attendance: How does attendance work at the high school?

- Each student is permitted **10** parent excuses per school year for absences.
- If a student is absent due to medical reasons, documentation is required from a medical professional.
- IEP or 504 Plan DOES NOT = MEDICAL EXCUSE REQUIRED to have a Doctor note to excuse for any tardiness, absences that exceed school policy by doctor turned into Mrs. Schaffer.
- Questions about attendance, student marked absent for a period/day/late call, and/or all attendance questions are to be directed to Mrs. Chickos at 724-266-2833, ext. 2335 And/or will be directed to Ms. Schaffer ext. 2265.
- Pennsylvania School Code requires that all students ages 6-18 must attend school.

Attendance Notification Timeline and Excuses:

After (1) one unexcused absence, parents will receive an automated phone call. After (3) three unexcused absences, a letter will be sent home requesting that parents/guardians turn excuses in. After (7) seven unexcused absences, student and parent will be asked to attend a truancy meeting with Ms. Schaffer and the Beaver County Truancy Prevention Team.

If students continue to accumulated an excessive amount of unexcused absences, the school is required to file to the magistrate office for truancy which can result in fines / fees.

SAP Coordinator (Student Assistance Program):

SAP is a confidential and voluntary program which provides support to students who are facing barriers that may be impacting their academic or personal life. Our goal is to help your child succeed in school.

- I will work with you and your student to access services at school and in your community if you or your child is having troubling in or out of school with the following concerns including, but not limited to:

- WEIGHTED COURSES -- A student must earn an "A," "B," or "C" grade to receive the additional weighted value. A student who receives a "D" will obtain the credit value for the course but not the weighted value. The following is an outline of courses that have additional weight.
- Grading Terms:
- Weighted GPA will be calculated in two steps. The first step is to calculate a "Non-Weighted GPA" on a 4.0 scale. Once this GPA is calculated, an add-on factor for "Advanced Placement" and
- "Honors" combined with the Non-Weighted GPA in the following manner. All course weight is assigned by course, not by grade level.

5. National Honor Society: Students must have five semesters (Freshman: Fall (1) / Spring (2) ; Sophomore: Fall (3) / Spring (4) Junior: Fall (5) – application) completed fully for application, and a 3.6 cumulative GPA from five semesters of enrollment at Ambridge High School. This occurs for all students their junior year after the fall start. Sophomores and Freshman are not applicable for the NHS at this time, as their 9th and 10th grade year, and Fall of their 11th grade year is required to be completed in order to be calculated into the GPA qualification for the application.

<u>NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY</u> -- AAHS is proud to recognize successful students. Selection into the National Honor Society is a great achievement for any student. The selection process begins with academics. Students must qualify with specific grade point averages. Juniors must have a cumulative 3.6 or higher after five semesters. Seniors can qualify with a cumulative 3.6 after seven semesters. In addition to these grade point requirements, students will also be evaluated on their involvement in activities and clubs, as well as character ratings.
