What is S.A.P.?

(Student Assistance Program)

The Student Assistance Program, or SAP is a confidential and voluntary program which provides support to students who are facing barriers that may be impacting their academic or personal life. In Pennsylvania, every school district is required to have a SAP program. A SAP team is utilized to access support services at school and in your communities. If your child is having trouble in or out of school, the SAP team can help.

Our Goal

Our goal is to help your child succeed in school. Students come to the SAP team in different ways. Any school staff, administration, friend or family member can let the SAP team know that they are worried about someone. The students themselves can even go directly to the SAP team to ask for help. However, the SAP team will not become involved unless we receive parent permission.

REMEMBER YOU ARE PART OF THE TEAM FOR YOUR CHILD!!

<u>PRIVACY</u>

The Student Assistance Teams and the school will respect you and your child's privacy at all times.

HOW DOES MY CHILD BECOME INVOLVED IN THE PROGRAM?

- Your child was referred because someone was concerned about child.
- The team will gather information about your child's performance in school from you, school administration and school staff who have contact with your child.
 - The SAP team will request that you sign a permission form for your child to become involved in the program.
- The SAP team will create a plan of action to help your child achieve success in school.
