WHO CAN APPLY

· High school seniors residing in Beaver County.

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

- Covers in-county tuition and fees, excluding course related fees and flight fees.
- · Scholarship awarded after any federal or state grants.
- If a student is selected and accepts, they are expected to be full participants in the CCBC Honors Program.
- The scholarship (if renewed) covers up to 65 credits over 2 consecutive academic years (fall, spring, summer, fall, spring, summer).
- Renewable each semester as long as the following criteria are met each semester:
 - Student remains in good standing while maintaining a minimum 3.0 GPA
 - 12 combined institutional and community volunteer hours completed
 - 2 personal enhancement hours completed
 - 1 Honors course completed (as allowed by academic program)

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete CCBC Application for Admissions at ccbc.edu
- · Complete 2025-2026 FASFA Online
- Complete Honors Scholarship paper application or online application.
- · Submit the following supporting documents:
 - High school transcripts/college coursework transcripts. Must include a record of most recent grades earned in senior year up until December 2024, if not already included in transcript
 - A one-page essay or one-minute video answering the question: "How will your experience as a CCBC Honors Student help you achieve your academic, career, and/or community engagement goals?"
 - A summary of service, leadership, and involvement in both scholastic and community settings.
 - A letter of recommendation.
- CCBC Application, FASFA, Honors Scholarship application and supporting documents must be received by March 3, 2025. Submit via:

HONORS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The CCBC Honors Program provides an academically challenging and enriching learning experience for students to develop their potential as leaders in a complex and culturally diverse society. Honors students are encouraged to participate in learning experiences outside of the classroom and the campus and are expected to engage in meaningful scholarly research that will help them prepare for the next phase of their lives.

CCBC Honors Scholarship Recipients are immediately eligible for and expected to enroll in Honors courses and participate fully in the Honors Program.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Challenging academic Honors courses with emphasis on scholarly research that addresses issues impacting global concerns, international perspectives, or intercultural solutions to significant challenges.
- · Personalized mentorship on personal, academic, and professional goals.
- Unique events specialized for Honors students.
 Acknowledgment as a leader on campus and as a representative of CCBC in the community.
- After succeeding in 12 credits of honors courses and requirements, CCBC diploma and transcript notation of Honors Student and honors course of study.
- · Special recognition at CCBC's commencement ceremony.

EXPECTATIONS

- · Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Complete 12 hours of volunteerism at either CCBC-sponsored/hosted events or through outside volunteering (verified by Honors Program) each semester.
- · Participate in at least 2 hours of personal or professional enhancement each semester.
- Enroll in and complete at least 1 honors course per semester/12 total honors credits by the end of your career at CCBC (as your academic history and program of study allow).



VOLUNTEER IDEAS

ON-CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES can include:

- Volunteer at CCBC events, such as Titan Student Orientation, Celebration Week, Commencement, and other events throughout the year.
- Volunteer with the Student Life Office, President's Office, or Provost's Office to help coordinate events and develop special projects.
- Work with peer students one-on-one, helping them chart their path to success at CCBC, coordinated through the Student Life Office.
- Develop service/charity fundraising initiatives for a student organization.

OFF-CAMPUS OPPORTUNITIES can include:

- Volunteer with local non-profit organizations in the community.
- Participate in charity and/or volunteerism in your church or faith organization.
- Participate in a volunteer program to help local youth through a school district or local library.

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COMPLETE THE FAFSA

Student and Parent (if dependent*) must create an account (FSA ID) at *studentaid.gov.*

Then complete the FAFSA online at *studentaid.ed.gov* under the "FAFSA Form" menu. Log in using the student FSA ID and Password

Make sure you complete the correct year (Ex: the 2025-2026 academic year begins Fall 2025). 2025-2026 FAFSA will be available by 12/1/2024.

**Most students who are under 24 not married and do not have dependents are considered dependent and will need to provide parent information.

Our Federal School Code is 006807-00

Student applying for private student loans must complete a FAFSA.

2. COMPLETE REQUESTED DOCUMENTS

Once your FAFSA is received(normally 2-3 business days after you submit it) the Financial Aid Office will send you an email if more information is needed to complete verification of your file.

If requested you will need to login to your CCBC Financial Aid Portal to complete the required documentation.

Not all students are selected for verification so only complete this step if requested to do so.

3. REVIEW COLLEGE FINANCING PLAN

Once your file is completed and your eligibility for Federal Pell Grant is determined a College Financing Plan will be sent to you via email to the email address you put on the FAFSA

If you would like a student loan and are a new student loan borrower or have not had a loan within the past two years you will need to complete the Master Promissory Note(MPN) and Entrance Counseling online at studentaid.gov and then complete the loan request form found online at https://www.ccbc.edu/ApplyingforAid.

If you have had a loan in the past two years you will not be required to complete the MPN and Entrance Counseling but will need to complete the loan request form.

4. DISBURSEMENT OF AID

Once you receive your College Financing Plan you can ensure that your aid is enough to cover your tuition and fees if not contact the Financial Aid Office for additional resources that may be available.

Review your tuition and fees statement online at MyCCBC.

Students who have aid in excess of tuition and fees can use the excess funds in the bookstore the week before classes begin for each semester up until the end of the third week.

Any excess aid after tuition, fees and books will be disbursed to the student via check around the fifth week of the semester. Students with courses starting in later subterms may have their disbursement delayed.

ADDITIONAL TIPS AND REMINDERS

Students are required to make academic progress, withdrawing or failing classes may have an impact on your ability to get further aid. If you are thinking about dropping classes please contact Financial Aid. If you are interested in applying for scholarships please visit *ccbc.edu/scholarships*.
